NOTICE OF SERIES

NEWPORT YACHT CLUB 1999 SUMMER ONE DESIGN SERIES

SPONSOR: The Newport Yacht Club Regatta Committee

RULES: Racing will be conducted in accordance with the following: (1) the Racing Rules of Sailing 1997-2000, including the prescriptions of US Sailing; (2) Class Associations rules for One-Design classes; (3) This Notice of Race; (4) The NYC Sailing Instructions and any amendments thereto.

ELIGIBILITY: Boats that have completed the registration requirements with the Newport Yacht Club shall become an Eligible boat. To compete and be scored, an eligible boat must be properly registered with the Newport Yacht Club and have paid the registration fee. The Newport Yacht Club will provide a separate start for any one-design class with five or more boats which are properly registered by June 1, 1999.

REGISTRATION: Submit the entry form with the appropriate entry fee of \$55 for NYC members or \$65 for non-members to Newport Yacht Club, Regatta Committee, P.O. Box 488, Newport, R.I 02840. The waiver of liability must be signed by the boat owner and/or skipper.

LOCATION: The starting line for the summer one-design series will be in the area south of Rose Island.

SCHEDULE: Racing for the Summer one-design series will begin on June 1, 1999 and will continue on each following Tuesday evening until August 24, 1999. The warning signal will be at 1800.

SCORING: The low point scoring system described in appendix A of the Racing Rules of Sailing 1997-2000, including the prescriptions of US Sailing will be used. Standings will be based upon the lowest possible point total for 70% of the races held. Disqualifications may not be used as throwouts by any class.

ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES: 720 degree turns as described in the Racing Rules of Sailing 1997-2000, including the prescriptions of US Sailing Part 4 Rule 44.1 and 44.2, amended to require a boat which has accepted an Alternative Penalty and done her turns to advise the race committee after finishing. Protesting Boats must notify the race committee upon completion of the race of the boat being protested and must be flying flag bravo.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS: Will be available to all registered boats by May 1, 1999.

PRIZES: Will be awarded for the first three places in each class.
