

#### NOTICE OF RACE

This notice describes conditions and qualifications. Additional information will be supplied to race entrants.

#### CARLSBERG SOLO TWIN

The 1989 New England Singlehanded and Doublehanded Championships

The Carlsberg SOLO/TWIN are separate races--a singlehanded and a doublehanded--starting in Newport, Rhode Island, Friday, August 11. The races are organized by the Goat Island Yacht Club, Ltd.

Race Features. Time allowances for monhulls will be developed from <a href="PHRF-NB">PHRF-NB</a> ratings, applying a waterline adjustment. Multihulls will use the Greene performance andicaps of the New England Multihull Association.

The Boats. The races will be open to offshore sailing yachts at least 22 feet LOA. Entry will be limited to 70 boats, initially 35 for each race. Monohulls will not compete against multihulls. Divisions will be established following close of entries and will be determined by handicap ratings.

Crew. Previous SOLO/TWIN participants are automatically qualified, as are participants in the longer races hosted by the Goat Island Yacht Club, such as the Bermuda One/Two, C-STAR, and BOC.

For new entries in the Carlsberg SOLO/TWIN, crew must provide the race committee with a written statement of sailing experience, including evidence of at least one non-stop singlehanded (SOLO) or doublehanded (TWIN) passage of 25 miles or more. If the 25-mile passage is to be made in the 1989 season, it must be completed no later than July 30, 1989.

The race committee reserves the right to reject entries for any reason that it deems sufficient. In the event that any entrant has made false statements, entry will be refused and the entry fee will be forfeit.

Required Equipment and Use. For equipping the yacht, entrants should use as a guide the USYRU Offshore Racing Council's "Regulations Concerning Minimum Equipment and Accommodations" for category 3 races. The following modifications, amendments, and supplements to category 3 are specific requirements for this race:

- l) each **SOLO** yacht must have a system for self steering. Self-steering devices will be allowed on **TWIN** yachts.
- 2) each yacht must carry a VHF marine radiotelephone. Channel 71--required for race communication--must be installed.
- in lieu of the self-inflating life raft specified in category 3, yachts may carry a rigid unsinkable dinghy or a hand-inflatable tender. The survival gear for the life raft is to be self-selected.
- 4) each yacht must have a system, such as jack wires, running from near the cockpit to the foredeck, so that the crew can move from the stern to the forestay without disconnecting a safety harness.
- a safety harness must be worn and attached to the yacht from the time the yacht leaves the dock or mooring before the start, until it is secured after finishing, except when the crew is in the cockpit or belowdecks.
- visual distress signals must include two orange smoke signals and six red meteor or parachute flares. Three white flares or a powerful flashlight or spotlight independent of the yacht's electrical system must also be carried.
- 7) if freeboard at the transom is greater than 18", the yacht must have a system for re-boarding, such as looped lines or a ladder, in place at all times.
- 8) a radar reflector must be in place at least six feet above decks at all times.
- proper sail numbers must be displayed on the mainsail, spinnakers, and all headsails larger than a working jib. In the event of duplicate sail numbers, the later entry will be required to change.
- 10) a man-overboard pole and associated equipment are not required for SOLO yachts.
- SOLO yachts must fly International Code Pennant "Numeral One" from the backstay (or similar position); TWIN yachts must fly pennant "Numeral Two."
- While an auxilliary engine is not required, it is expected that each yacht will make her way to the starting line and return to port after the finish without tows or other assistance.

Required Equipment and Use. For equipping the yacht, entrants should use as a guide the USYRU Offshore Racing Council's "Regulations Concerning Minimum Equipment and Accommodations" for category 3 races. - While an auxilliary engine is not required, it is expected that each yacht will make her way to the starting line and return to port after the finish without tows or other assistance.

MSYRU racing rules will be observed, except that Rule 22 may be waived in regard to water ballasting or similar systems, and Rule 26 (Appendix 14) is waived.

All yachts must carry liability insurance.

Yachts must be available for inspection in Newport no later than the beginning of the required skipper's meeting, Thursday, August 10, 5:30 pm. An inspection check list will be provided following acceptance of entry.

The safety of each yacht and her crew is the sole responsibility of the owner and crew, who must insure that the yacht is fully found and seaworthy, and the crew is fit for the passage.

Entry Procedure. Send the completed entry form, a current PHRF-NB certificate, the statement of experience, along with a check for \$50 (Singlehanded), \$75 (Doublehanded) to Carlsberg SOLO/TWIN, PO Box 3422, Newport, RI 02840. Applications will be accepted in the order they are received, until August 1, unless the limit of yachts has been reached first. Once accepted, the entry fee is non-refundable; however, if a refund is requested before August 1, one-half of the fee will be returned. #### THE COURSE

The fourth annual Carlsberg Solo/Twin Race is a 100-mile ocean triangle (an overnight race), which begins and ends in Newport Harbor. Courses will differ for monohulls and multihulls and will be distributed at a later date. Details will follow to all those who enter.
