Each team should read the NOR and SIs carefully. Some instructions have changed from last year. The following is a list of some of the more important requirements. The list is not all inclusive and does not supplant your need to read the entire document.

We encourage all competitors to study **The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) for 2013-2016.** A free copy of the rules may be obtained by becoming a member of US Sailing, or may be purchased from various retail sources. SIGNIFICANT CHANGES FROM PRIOR YEARS

NEW SCHEDULE

NYC will increase the number of races by running a Spring, Summer and Fall Series for PHRF/Cruising Classes and a Summer and Fall Series for One-Designs. There <u>will</u> be racing on July 1 & 2 this year.

PHRF Cruising Class

Spring Series (Wednesday night): May 14 – June 25 (7 weeks)
Summer Series (Wednesday night): July 2 – August 27 (9 weeks)
Fall Series (Saturday): September 6 - 27 (4 weeks)

One-Design:

Summer Series (Tuesday night): June 3 – August 26 (13 weeks) Fall Series (Saturday): September 6 - 27 (4 weeks)

Pre-registered one-designs are invited to race Wednesday nights in May at no charge – 3 or more boats for a start.

REGISTRATION

Registration and payment is now online. Entrants must email or mail evidence of insurance and PHRF certificate, where applicable.

THROWOUTS

The number of throwouts has been changed to one (1) throwout for every four (4) races completed. A DNC (Did Not Compete) is an allowable throwout.

RACE COMMITTEE VOLUNTEERS:

Volunteers are invited to come out on the Race Committee signal boat to help make the racing fun and fair. This practice encourages the exchange of ideas and experiences -- competitors see how the committee operates and the committee gets feedback from race participants. Volunteering *will not* affect scoring this year.

Volunteers should sign up at least one week in advance on the NYC bulletin board, or by contacting Nancy Parrillo (nparrillo@cox.net or 508-574-1144). Please notify Nancy at least 48 hours ahead if you have to cancel so we can ensure proper staffing. Thank you.

PHRF CLASSES

There will be one spinnaker PHRF class this year and two non-spinnaker PHRF classes -- one for those with a PHRF rating below 190 (Class II) and one for those with a PHRF rating of 190 or higher (Class III). There must be at least three boats registered, with valid 2014 PHRF certificates from PHRF-NB, in each class 24 hours in advance of the first race for the class to be scored.

J/22 CLASS

The J/22's chartered from Sail Newport are not class legal and therefore will sail as a separate class, racing as a spinnaker class on Tuesdays and non-spinnaker on Wednesdays. If 3 or more non-Sail Newport J/22's are properly registered, they will be given a separate class. Alternatively, non-Sail Newport J/22's with valid rating certificates may sail as PHRF entrants on Wednesday nights.

Each J/22 crew shall pick a **Team Name**. These Team Names will be used instead of the skipper's name in scoring. Be sure to give the Race Committee your **Team Name** when you check in.

REQUIRED COAST GUARD NOTICES

Operating in a negligent manner (as determined by the Coast Guard) may cause this series to be terminated.

- If a competing yacht causes a commercial vessel (that is unable to maneuver) to sound 3 or more sound signals, the competitor is subject to protest by the Race Committee.
- All participants are subject to the Navigation Rules of the Road. You do not automatically become "stand-on" or "privileged" by virtue of your participation.
- You are not exempt from following Rule 9 of the Navigation Rules, which prohibits interference with vessels that can only navigate within "narrow channels or fairways." Note the preamble to Part 2 of the RRS.
- In decreased visibility (less than two nautical miles), participants must comply with the COLREGS sound signal requirements.

GUIDELINES FOR CANCELLING RACING DUE TO WEATHER

First and foremost, **it is the individual skipper's responsibility** to decide whether the conditions are appropriate for their crew and boat. (RRS 4)

The NYC Race Committee will use the following **GUIDELINES** in judging whether racing should be cancelled on any given day. All decisions will be made based on weather observations at 5:00 p.m. (noon in September), and will be communicated by the appropriate flag signals at NYC and broadcast over VHF channel 73.

WIND

• Sustained winds greater than 25 knots or below 5 knots, using inputs from the wind reading on the top of the Hyatt or Rose Island as displayed on Sailflow and other sources. The wind reading in the clubhouse will be used as a guide.

Sustained winds of 20-25 knots, racing will be at the discretion of the Race Committee.
 Realizing that the committee is made up of volunteers, the Race Committee has the same responsibility to their crew as race boats.

FOG

- If the New York Yacht Club flagstaff can be seen from NYC (approx. 1 nm), racing will most likely be held (see COLREGS sound signal requirements for visibility less than 2 nm). In addition to the harbor view, the Race Committee will use the Newport Harbor webcams to assess fog on the bay. In making a decision, the Race Committee recognizes that not all boats racing will have electronics to navigate and may lack the ability to see others or to determine where they are.
- Newport Harbor webcams are available at www.riyachting.com.

RAIN/LIGHTNING

- When thunderstorms or lightning are predicted or observed within 10 miles of NYC, racing will be cancelled or postponed until the storms have passed.
- Rain alone will not necessarily be a reason to cancel racing.

SUMMER SERIES: (Tuesdays) JUNE 3 - AUGUST 26, 2014 FALL SERIES: (Saturdays) SEPT 6 - 27, 2014 NOTICE OF RACE

1. ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

1.1 The Organizing Authority (OA) is the Newport Yacht Club (NYC) Regatta Committee.

2. RULES

- 2.1 Racing will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 2.2 Where there is conflict between this Notice of Race (NOR) and the Sailing Instructions (SIs), the SIs shall prevail except that neither shall change nor alter any class rules except that which is listed in NOR 2.3. This changes RRS 63.7.
- 2.3 Class rules that prohibit the use of VHF radios while racing are waived for the duration of the series for the purpose of safety and for receiving pertinent race information and NOAA weather.
- 2.4 Rules 29.2, 44.1 and 64.1(a) are amended. The amendments are described in the sailing instructions.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 All One-Design class boats are invited to race in the Summer and Fall Series. Racing is open to all eligible boats that have registered. To compete and be scored, a boat must be properly registered with the Newport Yacht Club Regatta Committee as required by paragraph 4 of this NOR.
- 3.2 The Newport Yacht Club will provide a start for any one-design class with three or more boats that are properly registered at least 24 hours before a race.
- 3.3 Each entrant is encouraged to provide a Race Committee volunteer at least once during the racing season. Each such volunteer should be one of the entrant's regular racing crew. Entrants may provide a volunteer on the nights they are NOT racing or at a special event designated by the race committee (e.g., Tuesday night one design volunteers for Wednesday night PHRF racing and vice versa). There should be no need to sail short-handed or not sail due to too few crew since entrants can provide volunteers on non-racing nights. A signup sheet will be posted on the Newport Yacht Club bulletin board.

4. FEES AND REGISTRATION

- 4.1 Complete registration and payment online at https://newportyachtclub.worldsecuresystems.com/Racing/onshore/OneDesign/one-design. To be properly registered, online registration must be completed and the following documents must be received at least 24 hours prior to the first race in which the competitor will be scored:
- 4.1.1 Email, fax or mail evidence of liability insurance to: office@newportyachtclub.org, fax: 401-849-9060, or Newport Yacht Club Regatta Committee, 110 Long Wharf, Newport, RI 02840.
- 4.1.2 Entry fees are as follows. Add late fee of \$25 if registering <u>after</u> the first day of racing. US Sailing members receive a 10% discount.

4.2 The OA reserves the right to accept or deny entries submitted beyond stated deadlines.

5. SCHEDULE

5.1 The Summer series will be conducted on Tuesday evenings. The new Fall Series will be

conducted on Saturdays.

Summer Series: June 3 - August 26, 2014 (13 weeks) Fall Series: Sept 6 - 27, 2014 (4 weeks)

There will be racing on July 1. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race will be 1800 hours on Tuesdays and 1300 hours on Saturdays in September.

6. **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

6.1 The sailing instructions are available in this Sailing Directory and on the NYC web site, http://www.newportyachtclub.org/.

7. VENUE

- 7.1 Racing will be held on Narragansett Bay.
- 7.2 The starting area will generally be in the vicinity west of Goat Island and north of Fort Adams.

8. COURSES

8.1 A chart indicating the location of marks and a list of possible courses (the South Bay chart) is available from the NYC Club Steward office or Dock office, or from Sail Newport. The Race Committee will post courses using a combination of government and special marks. Refer to the Sailing Instructions for a more detailed description of the courses.

9. PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 Rule 44.1 is changed so that the One-Turn Penalty replaces the Two-Turns Penalty.

10. SCORING

- 10.1 The scoring system is the low-point system as described in RRS Appendix A.
- 10.2 There will be one throwout for every four races completed. A DNC (Did Not Compete) is an allowable throwout.
- 10.3 One race shall constitute a series.

11. RADIO & MOBILE PHONE COMMUNICATION

11.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction applies to mobile telephones. At its discretion, the Race Committee may communicate with competitors using VHF Channel 73.

12. PRIZES

- 12.1 Prizes will be awarded for each series based on the number of entrants in each class.
 - 12.1.1 The first three places in each class if there are 7 or more boats registered in that class.
 - 12.1.2 First and second places for classes that consist of 4 to 6 boats registered in that class
 - 12.1.3 First place only for classes that consist of less than 4 boats registered in that class.

13. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

13.1 Competitors participate in this series entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4, Decision to Race. The OA will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the series.

SUMMER SERIES: (Tuesdays) JUNE 3 - AUGUST 26, 2014 FALL SERIES: (Saturdays) SEPT 6 – 27, 2014 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 Racing will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 Rule 29.2 is amended as follows: A recalled class will restart after all subsequent classes in the original starting sequence. The warning signal for the recalled class will be approximately one minute after the start of the last scheduled class. If there is more than one general recall, class order will be maintained with the warning signal of each general recalled class approximately one minute after the start of the previously recalled class.
- 1.3 Rule 44.1 is changed so that the One-Turn Penalty replaces the Two-Turns Penalty. A boat that has accepted an Alternative Penalty and completed its turn must notify the Race Committee to that effect after finishing.
- 1.4 Rule 64.1(a) has been amended as follows: The penalty, if any, for infringement of a rule other than a rule of RRS Part 2 will be at the discretion of the Protest Committee and may be other than disqualification.

2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

2.1 The Summer series will be conducted on Tuesday evenings. The new Fall Series will be conducted on Saturdays.

Summer Series: June 3 - August 26, 2014 (13 weeks) Fall Series: Sept 6 - 27, 2014 (4 weeks)

There will be racing on July 1. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race will be 1800 hours on Tuesdays and 1300 hours on Saturdays in September.

3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS and CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors and changes to the sailing instructions will be posted on the Regatta bulletin board located at the Newport Yacht Club.
- 3.2 Any changes to the Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be posted on the Regatta bulletin board five days before they are to take effect, and may be posted on the NYC web site at http://www.newportyachtclub.org.

4. RACE COMMITTEE SIGNALS

- 4.1 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE
- 4.1.1 Signals made ashore will be hoisted on the flagstaff at the Newport Yacht Club and broadcast on VHF Channel 73 at 1700 hours (at 1200 on Saturdays). An earlier broadcast may occur.
- 4.1.2 Code flags "N" over "A" coincident with 3 sound signals means "All racing is abandoned, no more racing today."
- 4.2 STARTING AREA SIGNALS
- 4.2.1 Starting signals will be made in accordance with the RRS Rule 26 (5 minute sequence).
- 4.2.2 The scheduled time for the warning signal for the first race each day is 1800 hours on Tuesdays and 1300 hours on Saturdays in September. Course(s) will be displayed on the starboard side of the Race Committee boat. Information for each class reads top to bottom below the designator numeral or class insignia for each class.
- 4.2.3 The starting/finishing line will be between the orange flag on the Race Committee

- boat and the port-end starting mark.
- 4.2.4 Boats in a class whose warning signal has not been made shall keep clear of the starting area.
- 4.2.5 A boat shall not start later than **4 minutes** after its starting signal.
- 4.2.6 Two or more boats of the same class must start within their time limit for a race to be scored for that class.
- 4.2.7 At its discretion, the Race Committee may communicate with competitors using VHF Channel 73.

5. RACING CLASSES AND FLAGS

In order to avoid confusion, we request each one-design class to provide the Race Committee with a Class flag to be used as the warning signal for the start of that class. Otherwise, the warning signal for each class shall consist of the numeric pennants as described in the table below.

J/70	J	Pennant 1 or J/70 Class Flag
Viper	V	Pennant 2 or Viper Class Flag
J22 (Sail Newport charter fleet)	J22	Pennant 3 or J22 Class Flag

S Boats	S	Pennant 5 or S Boat Class Flag

The pennant number does NOT indicate the order of starts, which may be changed by the Race Committee by hailing boats prior to the hoisting of the first warning signal. Other classes eligible for a start will be assigned a designator, a flag and a position in the starting sequence by the Race Committee and posted on the Regatta Committee bulletin board at the Club, or announced on channel 73 or by hailing the competitors.

6 STARTING SEQUENCE

6.1 The starting sequence will follow RRS 26 and is provided below. Times shall be taken from the visual signals; the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded, and is not grounds for Redress. Class flags always indicate the next class to start.

Signal	Flag and Sound	Minutes Before Starting Signal
Warning	Class Flag, 1 sound	5
Preparatory	Code Flag "P", 1 sound	4
Prep Down	Prep Flag removed, 1 long sound	1
Start	Class flag removed, 1 sound	0

- 6.2 Each class start is independent of another unless indicated as below. A short delay may take place between class start and the ensuing warning signal. However, it is the intent of the Race Committee to conduct rolling starts, whereby the start of one class will be concurrent with the warning for the next class, including any class restarting as a result of a general recall (see section 1, Rules, changes to Rule 29.2).
- 6.3 Two or more classes may be started at the same time. Multiple class flags will be flown as the warning signal in this case.

7. RACING AREAS

- 7.1 Racing will be held on Narragansett Bay.
- 7.2 The starting area will generally be in the vicinity west of Goat Island and north of Fort Adams.

8. THE COURSES

- 8.1 The courses will be selected from the current South Bay course chart.
- 8.2 SPECIAL COURSES: The Race Committee reserves the option to select courses that are not listed on the South Bay chart. With this option, code flag "O" (red/yellow

- diagonal) will be displayed. Instead of a course number, individual marks as described on the South Bay chart will be posted under the class designator on the committee boat in the order they are to be rounded and will indicate the side (P or S) to leave each mark.
- 8.3 A number in parentheses below a course indicates the number of laps to be sailed, one (1) being understood. For instance, a number two in parentheses (2) under a course indicates that the entire course is to be sailed twice around. This does NOT include sailing through the start/finish line during subsequent laps unless the start/finish mark is also a mark of the course. See 8.4 below.
- 8.4 Once a boat has started properly, she <u>shall not</u> sail through the start/finish line other than to finish unless the start/finish mark is also a mark of the course.

9. MARKS

9.1 Marks used will be a combination of government and special marks and selected from the current edition of the South Bay Racing Chart. The course number for each class will be posted under the class designator on the starboard side of the signal boat. Round marks in the order listed. Leave each mark on the side indicated by the letter following the mark as indicated on the South Bay Chart (p = port, s = starboard).

10. AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

- 10.1 The following areas are designated as obstructions: the area of Dumplings or between those rocks and Jamestown shore; the rock near Fort Wetherill and the Jamestown shore; Citing Rock east of Rose Island; and Rose Island.
- 10.2 Competitors shall not sail between Rose Island and the Newport Bridge.
- 10.3 Competitors are to pass under the Newport (Pell) Bridge through the center span only in order to accommodate the ongoing painting project. This instruction may be modified during the season.

11. THE START

- 11.1 The starting line will be between the orange flag displayed on the signal boat at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end orange starting mark.
- 11.2 Boats starting later than four (4) minutes after their starting signal will be scored "Did not Start" and will be scored according to RSS Appendix A (A4.2 and A5).
- 11.3 The RC reserves the option to run additional races. To indicate racing, code flag "R" (yellow cross on red square) will be displayed on the signal boat when the first boat in a class finishes. A class designator posted on the course board will indicate an additional race for that class.

12. THE FINISH

12.1 The finish line will be between the orange flag displayed on the signal boat and the orange starting mark. When a course is shortened (code flag "S"), the finish will be between an orange flag on the signal boat and the nearby mark.

13. TIME LIMIT

13.1 The first boat in a class must finish no later than 30 minutes after sunset (as published in Eldritch) for the race to be scored. Any boat not finishing within 30 minutes after the first boat in their class or within 30 minutes after sunset will be scored DNF.

14. PROTESTS

- 14.1 A protesting boat must comply with RRS 61.1 and must notify the Race Committee of their intent to protest upon finishing the race in which the incident occurred.
- 14.2 Protests shall be filed at the Newport Yacht Club by 9:00 PM on the <u>day after</u> the race. A protest form is included in this Directory. Additional forms are available at Newport Yacht Club. Protestors may deposit completed forms in the Regatta Committee box located in the hallway on the first floor of the Club or email them to: Office@NewportYachtClub.org

15. SCORING

- 15.1 Races will be scored using the low point system described in *Appendix A*.
- 15.2 Each yacht entered in a series shall be scored for each race started by the Race Committee and not subsequently abandoned.
- 15.3 There will be one throwout for every four races completed. A DNC (Did Not Compete) is an allowable throwout.
- 15.4 Unregistered boats will not be scored.
- 15.5 All boats will be scored based on their registered sail number, or, in the case of the J/22 class, the registered Team Name.

16. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 16.1 CHECKING IN Each boat shall sail by the Race Committee boat before their class preparatory signal to identify by voice her sail number, the class in which she will be racing, and her Team Name where applicable. Each boat shall receive acknowledgement from the Race Committee.
- 16.2 WITHDRAWAL Boats withdrawing from a race shall inform the Race Committee as soon as possible, either directly or on VHF Channel 73. Any yacht unable to contact the RC directly shall report its withdrawal to the NYC Dock Office (Tel: 401-846-9410) and ask to have the information relayed to the Race Committee. **Note: This is mandatory. Failure to notify will result in a DNC for that evening's race(s).**
- 16.3 For all children less than 13 years of age, USCG and NYC require that they wear a USCG approved Personal Floatation Device whenever they are aboard a boat unless they are below decks or in an enclosed cabin.

17. DISCAIMER OF LIABILITY

17.1 Sailing is an activity that carries with it an inherent risk of damage or injury. Competitors participate in this series entirely at their own risk and are reminded to adhere to RRS 4, Decision to Race.

Spring Series: May 14 – June 25, 2014 (7 weeks) Summer Series: July 2 - August 27, 2014 (9 weeks) Fall Series: Sept 6 – 27, 2014 (4 weeks)

There will be racing on July 2. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race will be 1800 hours on Wednesdays and 1300 hours on Saturdays in September.

6. **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

6.1 The sailing instructions are available in this Sailing Directory and on the NYC website, http://www.newportyachtclub.org/.

7. VENUE

- 7.1 Racing will be held on Narragansett Bay.
- 7.2 The starting area will generally be in the vicinity west of Goat Island and north of Fort Adams.

8. COURSES

8.1 A chart indicating the location of marks and a list of possible courses (the South Bay chart) is available at the NYC Club Steward office or Dock Office, or at Sail Newport. The Race Committee will post specific courses, using a combination of government and special marks. Refer to the Sailing Instructions for a more detailed description of the courses.

9. CLASS ASSIGNMENT

9.1 Class assignments and starting sequence are described in the Sailing Instructions. Any changes will be posted on the NYC racing bulletin board, and may be posted on the NYC website. A class consists of three or more boats. There will be a separate, non-spinnaker start for the eligible one-design classes in the series, if three or more boats are registered 48 hours before the first warning signal.

10. PENALTY SYSTEM

10.1 Rule 44.1 is changed so that the One-Turn Penalty replaces the Two-Turns Penalty.

11. SCORING

- 11.1 The scoring system is the low-point system as described in RRS Appendix A will apply.
- 11.2 There will be one throwout for every four races completed. A DNC (Did Not Compete) is an allowable throwout.
- 11.3 One race shall constitute a series.

12. RADIO COMMUNICATION

12.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. At its discretion, the Race Committee may communicate with competitors using VHF Channel 73.

13. PRIZES

- 13.1 Prizes will be awarded for each series based on the number entrants in each class.
 - 13.1.2 The first three places in each class if there are 7 or more boats registered in that class.
 - 13.1.3 First and second places for classes that consist of 4 to 6 boats registered in that

class.

13.1.4 First place only for classes that consist of less than 4 boats registered in that class.

14. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

14.1 Competitors participate in this series entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4, Decision to Race. The OA will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction wit or prior to, during, or after the series.

NEWPORT YACHT CLUB 2014 SUMMER PHRF CLASSES MAY 15, 2014 THROUGH AUGUST 28, 2014 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 Racing will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 Rule 29.2 is amended as follows: A recalled class will restart after all subsequent classes in the original starting sequence. The warning signal for the recalled class will be approximately one minute after the start of the last scheduled class. If there is more than one general recall, class order will be maintained with the warning signal of each general recalled class approximately one minute after the start of the previously recalled class.
- 1.3 Rule 44.1 is changed so that the One-Turn Penalty replaces the Two-Turns Penalty. A boat that has accepted an Alternative Penalty and completed its turn must notify the Race Committee to that effect after finishing.
- 1.4 Rule 64.1(a) has been amended as follows: The penalty, if any, for infringement of a rule other than a rule of RRS Part 2 will be at the discretion of the Protest Committee and may be other than disqualification.

2. SCHEDULE OF RACES

2.1 The Spring and Summer series will be conducted on Wednesday evenings. The new Fall Series will be conducted on Saturdays.

Spring Series: May 14 – June 25, 2014 (7 weeks) Summer Series: July 2 - August 27, 2014 (9 weeks) Fall Series: Sept 6 – 27, 2014 (4 weeks)

There will be racing on July 2. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race will be 1800 hours on Wednesdays and 1300 hours on Saturdays in September.

3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS and CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors and changes to the sailing instructions will be posted on the Regatta bulletin board located at the Newport Yacht Club.
- 3.2 Any changes to the Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be posted on the Regatta bulletin board five days before they are to take effect and may be posted on the NYC web site at http://www.newportyachtclub.org.

4. RACE COMMITTEE SIGNALS

- 4.1 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE
- 4.1.1 Signals made ashore will be hoisted on the flagstaff at the Newport Yacht Club and broadcast on VHF Channel 73 at 1700 hours on Wednesdays and at noon on Saturdays. An earlier broadcast may occur.
- 4.1.2 Code flags "N" over "A" followed by 3 sound signals means "All racing is abandoned, no more racing today."
- 4.2 STARTING AREA SIGNALS
- 4.2.1 Starting signals will be made in accordance with the RRS Rule 26 (5 minute sequence).
- 4.2.2 The scheduled time for the warning signal for the first race each day is 1800 hours on Wednesday and 1300 hours on Saturday. Course(s) will be displayed on the starboard side of the Race Committee boat. Information for each class reads top to bottom below the designator numeral or class insignia for each class.
- 4.2.3 Code flags "N" over "A" coincident with 3 sound signals means "All racing is abandoned, no more racing today."
- 4.2.4 The starting/finishing line will be between the orange flag on the Race Committee boat and

- the port-end starting mark.
- 4.2.5 Boats in a class whose warning signal has not been made shall keep clear of the starting area.
- 4.2.6 A boat shall not start later than **4 minutes** after its starting signal.
- 4.2.7 Two or more boats of the same class must start within the time limit for a race to be scored for that class.
- 4.2.8 At its discretion, the Race Committee may communicate with competitors using VHF Channel 73.

5. RACING CLASSES AND FLAGS

The warning signal for each class shall consist of the numeric pennants as described in the table below.

PHRF Class II	Pennant 2	Non-spinnaker Below 190
PHRF Class III	Pennant 3	Non-spinnaker 190 or Above

Ensign	*E*	N/A

5.1 The pennant number does NOT indicate the order of starts, which may be changed by the Race Committee by hailing boats prior to the hoisting of the first warning signal. PHRF Class divisions will be based on the ratings of registered boats. Any changes to these class divisions will be posted on the NYC Race Committee bulletin board 24 hours prior to the first warning signal of the first race in the series.

6.0 STARTING SEQUENCE

6.1 The starting sequence will follow RRS 26 and is provided below. Times shall be taken from the visual signals; the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded, and is not grounds for Redress. Class flags always indicate the next class to start.

Signal	Flag and Sound	Minutes Before Starting Signal
Warning	Class Flag, 1 sound	5
Preparatory	Code Flag "P", 1 sound	4
Prep Down	Prep Flag removed, 1 long sound	1
Start	Class flag removed, 1 sound	0

- 6.2 Each class start is independent of another unless indicated as below. A short delay may take place between class start and the ensuing warning signal. However, it is the intent of the Race Committee to conduct rolling starts, whereby the start of one class will be concurrent with the warning for the next class, including any class restarting as a result of a general recall (see section 1, Rules, changes to Rule 29.2).
- 6.3 Two or more classes may be started at the same time. Multiple class flags will be flown as the warning signal in this case.

7. RACING AREAS

- 7.1 Racing will be held on Narragansett Bay.
- 7.2 The starting area will generally be in the vicinity west of Goat Island, east of Rose Island and north of Fort Adams.

8. THE COURSES

- 8.1 The courses will be selected from the current South Bay course chart.
- 8.2 SPECIAL COURSES: The Race Committee reserves the option to select courses that are not listed on the South Bay chart. With this option, code flag "O" (red/yellow

- diagonal) will be displayed. Instead of a course number, individual marks as described on the South Bay chart will be posted under the class designator on the committee boat in the order they are to be rounded and will indicate the side (p = port, s = starboard) to leave each mark.
- 8.3 A number in parentheses below a course indicates the number of laps to be sailed, one (1) being understood. For instance, a number two in parentheses (2) under a course indicates that the entire course is to be sailed twice around. This does NOT include sailing through the start/finish line during subsequent laps unless the start/finish mark is also a mark of the course. See 8.4 below.
- 8.4 Once a boat has properly started, she <u>shall not</u> sail through the start/finish line other than to finish unless the start/finish mark is also a mark of the course.

9. MARKS

9.1 Marks used will be a combination of government and special marks and selected from the current edition of the South Bay Racing Chart. The course number for each class will be posted under the class designator on the starboard side of the signal boat. Round marks in the order listed. Leave each mark on the side indicated by the letter following the mark as indicated on the South Bay Chart (p = port, s = starboard).

10. AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

- 10.1 The following areas are designated as obstructions: the area of Dumplings or between those rocks and Jamestown shore; the rock near Fort Wetherill and the Jamestown shore; Citing Rock east of Rose Island: and Rose Island.
- 10.2 Competitors shall not sail between Rose Island and the Newport Bridge.
- 10.3 Competitors are to pass under the Newport (Pell) Bridge through the center span only; this to accommodate the ongoing painting project. This instruction may be modified during the season.

11. THE START

- 11.1 The starting line will be between the orange flag displayed on the signal boat at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end orange starting mark.
- 11.2 Boats starting later than four (4) minutes after their starting signal will be scored "Did not Start" and will be scored according to RSS Appendix A (A4.2 and A5)
- 11.3 The RC reserves the option to run additional races. To indicate racing, code flag "R" (yellow cross on red square) will be displayed on the signal boat when the first boat in a class finishes. A class designator posted on the course board will indicate an additional race for that class.

12. THE FINISH

12.1 The finish line will be between the orange flag displayed on the signal boat and the orange starting mark. When a course is shortened (code flag "S"), the finish will be between an orange flag on the signal boat and the nearby mark.

13. TIME LIMIT

13.1 All boats finishing later than 30 minutes after sunset will be scored DNF.

14. PROTESTS

- 14.1 A protesting boat must comply with RRS 61.1 and must notify the Race Committee upon finishing its race.
- 14.2 Protests shall be filed at the Newport Yacht Club by 9:00 PM on the <u>day after</u> the race. A protest form is included in this Directory. Additional forms are available at Newport Yacht Club. Protestors may deposit completed forms in the Regatta Committee box located in the hallway on the first floor of the Club or email them to: Office@NewportYachtClub.org

15. SCORING

- 15.1 Races will be scored using the low point system described in *Appendix A*.
- 15.2 Each yacht entered in a series shall be scored for each race started by the Race Committee and not subsequently abandoned.
- 15.3 There will be one throwout for every four races completed. A DNC (Did Not Compete) is an allowable throwout.
- 15.4 Unregistered boats will not be scored.
- 15.5 All boats will be scored based on their registered sail number, or, in the case of the J/22 class, the registered Team Name.

16. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 16.1 CHECKING IN Each boat shall sail by the Race Committee boat before their class preparatory signal to identify by voice her sail number, the class in which she will be racing, and her Team Name where applicable. Each boat shall receive acknowledgement from the Race Committee.
- 16.2 WITHDRAWAL Boats withdrawing from a race shall so inform the Race Committee as soon as possible either directly or on VHF Channel 73. Any yacht unable to contact the RC directly shall report its withdrawal to the NYC Dock Office (Tel: 401-846-9410) and ask to have the information relayed to the Race Committee. **Note: This is mandatory. Failure to notify will result in a DNC for that evening's race(s).**
- 16.3 For all children less than 13 years of age, USCG and NYC require that they wear a USCG approved Personal Floatation Device whenever they are aboard a boat unless they are below decks or in an enclosed cabin.

17. DISCAIMER OF LIABILITY

17.1 Sailing is an activity that carries with it an inherent risk of damage or injury. Competitors participate in this series entirely at their own risk and are reminded to adhere to RRS 4, Decision to Race.
